POTENTIAL PROPERTY PURCHASE

At the Town Board meeting on December 14, 2005, the Town Board authorized the Supervisor to sign a purchase offer for property at 1911 Rush Scottsville Road (north of the Town Hall at the intersection of Route 251). The Town Board has considered this property to be valuable to the Town for future use as the town grows. If we are successful in purchasing this property, we will then develop a plan for development of the entire site. At the February 8, 2006, Town Board meeting the Board accepted the counteroffer of the owner contingent on the town conducting a Phase 2 Environmental Study and accepting the results. A Phase 2 Environmental Study was done, the results evaluated and then shared with the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). We are awaiting input from the DEC. Senator Jim Alesi is sponsoring a \$100,000 grant from the Community Capital Assistance Program (CCAP) to assist us in the purchase of this property.

SALE OF HART'S FIELD

At the Town Board meeting on April 26, 2006, the Board approved the offering of the 18.72 acres of land which includes Hart's Field for sale. The funds obtained from the sale will be placed in the Recreation Reserve Fund and will be used for the development of recreation facilities on the 9 acres adjacent to the Town Hall. Reasons for the sale are: (1) High maintenance costs where little use is made by Recreation-sponsored programs, (2) Town Board decision to centralize recreation areas in the Hamlet making the facilities more accessible with improved security and lower maintenance costs.

PINNACLE ROAD BRIDGE CLOSURE over NYS THRUWAY

In my February/March and April/May newsletters I informed you of the planned closure of this bridge. It is still on schedule to

be closed on June 12, 2006, and re-opened on September 4th, 2006.

BRIDGE REPLACEMENT on ROUTE 15 over the LEHIGH VALLEY TRAIL

This bridge which was constructed in 1937 over the Lehigh Valley train route will be replaced. Estimated cost for this project is \$1.62 million. A small structure at a lower profile will replace the existing bridge.


The proposed method of construction is to work in two stages. In the first stage, which will begin as early as September 2006, traffic will be maintained on the existing roadway while the pre-cast structure is constructed under the existing structure. Upon completion of the structure, the traffic will be moved to an off-site detour while the existing superstructure and a portion of the existing abutments are removed along with the removal of fill needed to flatten the grades to the proposed elevations. It is anticipated this method of staging will help to minimize the amount of time the detour will be in effect. During final design, the use of incentive/disincentive clauses will be explored to help minimize the length of time the detour is in effect.

The planned detour route will be Route 251 from Route 15 to East River Road to Rush West Rush Road to Route 15. The approximate length of the detour is 5.2 miles.

OPEN BURN LAW

The Open Burn Law in Monroe County and the Town of Rush abides by the following:



Under the Monroe County Sanitary Code Article V and the New York State Fire Safety Code Section #307 - burning of trees, tree trimmings, leaves or brush, rubbish or garbage is **PROHIBITED**, however, the following exceptions for Agricultural Operations (this means a working farm) or a Recreational Campfire may be **GRANTED with PERMISSION** from the Fire Marshal or the Code Enforcement Officer. Contact them at 533-1312 or Fire Marshal 529-1563, Code Enforcement 463-7099.

FIREWORKS

Town of Rush Local Law #6, New York State Local Law #6, New York State Fire Safety Code Section 3301 and the New York state Penal Law Title 12, NYCRR Part 39 states:

Anyone wishing to have a fireworks display within the Town of Rush must make an application for such a permit five (5) days in advance of the date of display.

If you are not sure what you can do **legally**, please contact the Town Hall.

FREE FISHING DAYS



RUSH AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM

The Rush After school program will open for public registration on June 9th at the Rush Town Clerk's Office. The After School Program is a recreation-generated program which offers a safe, structured, supervised environment where your child can play, study and interact

with friends. Program activities include homework time, arts and crafts, games and gym time. The program runs from school dismissal until 5:30 PM Monday through Friday during the school year. The program does not run during vacations or days off indicated by the school calendar.

The program fee is based on a Monday-Friday registration. Quarterly payments are as follows for residents and non-residents of Rush.

YOUTH KAYAK CAMP



The Town of Rush Recreation, in cooperation with the Genesee Waterways Center, will be offering a "Summer Youth Kayak Camp" for ages 11-14 years old. The camp will be held August 14th, 15th 16th and 17th from 8:30 AM-12:30 PM. The children will be bused by the Rush Henrietta School Transportation, with a Recreation staff member, to the Erie Canal Lock 32 spillway on Clover Street in Pittsford. Three Genesee Waterways' professional staff members will instruct the campers on the safety and usage of kayaks.

Requirements for attending this camp are that participants must be able to swim 25 yards, and their parents must sign a "Release of Liability Waiver" for Genesee Waterways. The needed items are listed on the sign-up forms which are located at the Rush Town Hall Clerk's Office.

The Rush Fire District has ordered over \$48,000 worth of Motorola narrow band compliant radio equipment which included 60 pagers. We have put \$15,000 away over the last three years for this major upgrade. We have also ordered 24 SCBA (Air Packs) which will be paid for by a federal FEMA grant and money we have put away for that purchase. The fire district has taken delivery of 40 new padded chairs and four new tables for the meeting rooms. A new "diamond plate" plastic type floor was installed in the truck bay the West Rush station.

All the first line pumpers were service tested this spring; all passed with flying colors.

The fire district donated 1,200 feet of used 3" hose and 800' of used 1½ " hose to the Short Track Volunteer Fire Department; Honeoye Falls FD donated a used pumper but had no hose to give them.



Dear Residents,

Thank you to all who signed our **petition** in February and contacted their state legislators regarding increasing aid to libraries and library systems throughout New York. The focus of this effort was to convince the NYS legislators and Gov. Pataki to use **current** census information when calculating library aid. 9,500 signatures were collected throughout Monroe County and presented to the state legislature, and this advocacy effort resulted in legislature approval for additional aid. The Rush Library was noted for its high number of signatures!

We have finished compiling our circulation statistics for 2005, and I am pleased to report that our door count is up 20% for the year, and our circulation count has surpassed the previous year by 27%! I am delighted that so many of you make the Rush Library a destination of choice. The library staff works hard to make your visits pleasant, and we are always open to your suggestions and ideas.

Book Sale...Our Book Nook is overflowing! Many of you have donated your previously-enjoyed books to us during your spring cleaning, so now is the time for a book sale. Stop in from **June 12th-23rd** for some amazing bargains for your summer reading. Plus, if you buy a Rush Library Tote Bag for \$10.00, you can fill it right away with 2 hard covers or 5 paperbacks for free!

Library Cards...The long-anticipated new library cards are now available. The new design is the same for everyone in MCLS, and it comes with an additional key chain card for your convenience. If you are a new patron or if your old card no longer scans, it will be free. Replacements for lost cards cost \$1.


