The following is an update of town business:

Grant Approval

Our Grant request submitted under the Quality Communities Grant Program has been approved for \$38,800. We will be contacted in the near future by the Department of State to make arrangements for developing a contract. This Grant will enable us to undertake the Strategic Development Plan for the Hamlet of Rush and the Honeoye Creek Greenway, including the Village of Honeoye Falls. The first task is a more thorough review of the grant award and contact and the formation of an advisory committee. This is an exciting opportunity for us and others who have interest in the Honeoye Creek and Lehigh Valley Trail to work together over the next year to develop a common vision and action plan.

Automatic Door Controls

We have recently completed the installation of Automatic Door Controls at 2 grade level entries (1 at the south side of the Town Hall at the Court entrance and 1 at the west side of the Town Hall entry to the Library). This project was totally funded by a CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) through Monroe County.

Parks Grant Approval

Our original request for a Parks Grant was submitted in 2001 and re-submitted yearly since then. We have received notification of approval of \$100,000 which we are required to match in developing the 10.5 acres west of the Town Hall. Expiration of the grant is 12-31-08. We are presently developing a plan for the entire site which will include recreational facilities. After approval of this plan, we will prioritize all areas to be developed and proceed as soon as practical.

Sidewalk Installation

Sidewalk and curbing will be installed from the west parking lot to the Playground. This will replace the temporary gravel path that was installed last year. This sidewalk will be ADA compliant and is partially funded by a CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) through Monroe County. Total project cost is approximately \$16,300 of which \$10,000 will be paid by the grant.

2007 Budget

We expect to have a Preliminary Budget by early October and have a Public Hearing on the budget at our Town Board meeting of October 25. The deadline for the Final Budget is November 20th.

Property Purchase


We closed on the purchase of 1911 Rush Scottsville Road (corner of Routes 15A and 251) on July 31, 2006, for \$168,246.15, including all closing costs. Of that cost, Senator James Alesi sponsored a \$100,000 grant from the Community Capital Assistance Program (CCAP). We are including this parcel in our development plan of the entire site behind the Town Hall.

FIRE DISTRICT: The 2006 fire district budget was approved by the Board of Commissioners at the September meeting. The total budget is \$309,000. This includes equipment reserve fund towards new apparatus and major repairs or upgrades. **The tax rate submitted to the town for collection will be \$1.13 per thousand. THIS IS A REDUCTION IN YOUR TAXES.** By state law our spending limit for 2007 could have been \$ 370,000. **We prepared a budget \$61,000 BELOW that amount.** We can do this because of the generous

contributions made to the Rush FD Fund Drive by you the residents and taxpayers. Our insurance cost for 2007 is \$52,000. Our utility & fuel costs are \$28,000. Our equipment maintenance and other cost continue to go up also. Thanks to a 100% volunteer response force the personnel cost remain the same - zero!

EQUIPMENT: Two major projects are almost completed. The new SCAB (Air-packs) are in and members are being trained on their use. Rush received a federal grant for 90% of this purchase. They will be on the equipment soon. All the apparatus radios have been upgraded or replaced with radios that can be narrow-banded. All the members have been given new Minitor V pagers. This project cost \$50,000.

 **CODE ENFORCEMENT:** We are passing along a comment from the code enforcement people - it is a law that the driveway to your home must be clear of limbs and tree branches so a fire truck can get up to your house. Please be sure you are in compliance. If not it could delay the fire equipment and ambulance getting up to your home. House numbers are also required. If you do get permission to burn, you must stay in attendance at the burn.

FIRE PREVENTION: A full week schedule will be conducted at the Leary School and other locations during fire prevention week. We feel that these efforts do work and help control accidental fires and resulting injuries or death in Rush.

WINTER IS COMING: *The heating season will soon be here. If you have a wood stove PLEASE have your chimney cleaned. If you heat by gas or oil have the heating unit inspected. Over the years the Rush community has done a very good job in this area and with few exceptions, fires, death and injury has been minimal. We would like to see these incidents completely eliminated!*



FIRE DEPARTMENT & AMBULANCE: We welcome four new members into the department they are: Doug Barber, Brian Reynolds, Jonathan Scott and Werner Wandersleben.

FUND DRIVE: Our second request will be sent out soon. These reminders are for the residents who did not respond or told the firefighter who called on them that "they would mail it in" back in May. Over 900 of the 1,300 residents sent in a

donation - this is unheard of in most FD or EMS fund drives - **A SINCERE THANKS TO THOSE WHO RESPONDED!**

LADIES AUXILIARY: ELECTION DAY HAM DINNER - Tuesday - November 7th at the firehouse from 4:30 until 6:30 pm. Cost will be \$7.00 for Adults, \$6.00 for Seniors (60 and older), \$4.00 for children under 12. Pre-schoolers are FREE. Take outs are available. Proceeds from the dinner help fund the "Wilkins" scholarship given each year to a Rush student entering college. This year the **Betty Wilkins Scholarship of \$1,000 each** was presented to Michael Farrell, 1035 Rush West Rush Road and Elizabeth Symonds, 1173 Telephone Road. Congratulations to both winners.

As I write to you, the last official day of summer is winding down, and like many of you, my family and I are adjusting to the routine of the new school year. At the Library we make similar adjustments seasonally.... Fall brings budget planning, the return of story times, another book sale, and catching up on paperwork after our busy summer reading program. Also at this time I am pleased to report that we have experienced two consecutive months of record-breaking circulation statistics, which tells me that Rush residents really value their Library services! Have a look at our statistical charts at the end of this Newsletter, which demonstrate how much our circulation and patron count have increased over the last seven years even though the population of Rush has remained fairly constant, and we have had only one minor increase in operating hours (+2 hours/week in 2001.)

You may have noticed our newest staff members at your last visit. Please join me in welcoming Suzanne Beattie, Evan Vanable, and Lindsay Tallo to the Library team. They are working hard to learn the many procedures it takes to make a library run smoothly.

I hope you take an opportunity to check out the newly updated Monroe County Library System web site: www.libraryweb.org. The MCLS web design team spent many months creating a new site that highlights different branches, upcoming events, book and music reviews, and more. It's a great resource for everyone.

Our annual "Vote for Books" book sale will take place starting on Election Day, Nov. 7. Stop in for used book bargains starting at only 25¢! If you can't wait until Election Day for a good deal, you can shop from our Book Nook any time the Library is open. We offer hardcover and paperback bestsellers, non-fiction books, children's materials, and more. *Because we have been inundated with book donations recently, and because we have limited storage space, we will have to temporarily suspend the acceptance of book donations until the book sale ends on Nov.10th. Thank you for your understanding.* We'll see you at the sale!
