Workshop – Public Invited

Subject: Rush Hamlet & Honeoye Creek Greenway Plan

The workshop will cover the Inter-municipal Development Plan for the Hamlet of Rush, New York and Linear Trail System (future Greenway) paralleling Honeoye Creek to and including the Village of Honeoye Falls. The trail, creek and dam are the focal points of an evolving community center for the Town of Rush, and for the nearly completed trail system connecting the Hamlet to other community centers within a days walk, to the City of Rochester, the Erie Canal Trail and the Genesee Greenway. The project will result in a strategic development plan for the hamlet and adjacent greenway that will coordinate prior plans for four municipalities that otherwise would be advancing plans and seeking funding independently, promote inter-governmental cooperation at Regional, County and local levels, target economic development, prepare stakeholders in decision making, and prepare a unified action plan/strategy for advancing public objectives, implementing projects, and managing the greenway corridor.

The workshop will take place at the **Wildwood Country Club, Rush, New York on Saturday, November 3rd, 2007, from 9 AM to 1 PM.** For additional information, please call Councilman Richard Anderson at 533-2187 or myself, Bill Udicious at 533-9058.

The Town of Rush has received New York Department of State approval for a grant of \$38,800 to develop this plan.

Grant Approval


The Town of Rush has received approval of a \$25,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for Town Parks American Disability Act (ADA) restrooms. This grant will be used toward providing ADA compliant restrooms to service our outdoor recreational facilities.

2008 Operating Budget


The Town Board held Budget Workshop meetings on August 15th and 22nd to review all departments requests for 2008. Our goal is to provide necessary services to all residents while maintaining a stable tax rate. Unless we receive major surprises between now and budget approval time (in November) we should be able to remain at the total Town Tax Rate of \$4.26/\$1,000 of TAV (Taxable Assessed Valuation). Assuming this happens, for the 7 budget years, including 2008, the Town Tax Rate for the Operating Budget has increased an average of 2.22% per year, well below the rate of inflation.

I am including a couple of graphs with information from 2003 through 2008 Budget years which show the growth of the Taxable Assessed Valuation and the Property Tax increase over the same period.



Our 15 year Bond payment for the Revitalization & Building Project started in 2003 and has 10 years remaining. You will note on the Property Tax Rates graph that the yearly payment decreases every year.

Details of our approved 2008 Budget will appear in my December 2007 - January 2008 Newsletter.

FIRE MARSHAL and EMERGENCY
PREPAREDNESS ADMINISTRATOR**

Richard L. Tracy has been appointed Town of Rush Fire Marshal and Emergency Preparedness Administrator effective August 9, 2007, until December 31, 2007. This position is normally a yearly appointment effective January 1. Mr. Tracy is a certified Code Enforcement Officer and has many years of experience as a Fire Marshal. He will also serve as Fire Works Permit Officer and Deputy Code Enforcement Officer.

ASSESSOR

Kevin P. Quinlan has been appointed Sole Assessor for the Town of Rush effective October 1, 2007, and ending September 30, 2013. Sole Appointed Assessor appointments as prescribed in the Real Property Tax Law (RPTL) §310 shall be for a six year term of office. Current sole assessor terms expire September 30, 2007, statewide. Kevin has completed 37 years as an assessor in New York State and has obtained the highest state designation of a New York State Assessor which is an Assessor, Advanced. Kevin previously was the Assessor for the Town from 1996 to 2001.

We welcome Richard and Kevin to the Town of Rush, knowing that they will provide excellent service to all residents.

FIRE DISTRICT: The 2008 fire district budget was approved by the Board of Commissioners at the September meeting. The total budget is \$335,000. This includes equipment reserve fund towards new replacement apparatus and major repairs or upgrades.

The tax rate submitted to the town for collection will be \$1.12 per thousand. THIS IS A REDUCTION IN YOUR TOWN FIRE DISTRICT TAX. By state law our spending limit for 2008 could have been \$400,000. **We prepared a budget \$65,000 BELOW that amount.** We can do this because of the

generous contributions made to the Rush FD Fund Drive by you the residents and tax payers.

Our insurance cost for apparatus, buildings and workmen's compensation for 2008 is \$52,500. Our utility & fuel costs are \$40,000. Thanks to another new law, we also had to come up with money for an independent audit which could cost as much as \$5,000. We already have to do one for the comptroller, but that wasn't good enough! Our equipment maintenance and other cost continue to go up also. **Thanks to a 100% volunteer response force of the Rush Fire Department the personnel cost to protect you and respond to your emergencies remain the same - zero!**

There will be a Public Fire District Budget hearing at Fire Station #1 on the third Tuesday of October which will be the 16th. This date is set by a new NYS Law passed in 2006. The hearing will be held at 1971 Rush-Mendon Road, 6:30 pm.

FIRE DISTRICT SECRETARY POSITION: We are requesting resumes for the part-time Fire District Secretary position. Applicants should be organized, self-starters, have strong computer knowledge, ability to attend monthly meetings and take minutes. Knowledge of fire department operations is helpful. If you are interested, please forward your resume to Commissioner Larry Meston, Fire District Personnel Officer, Rush Fire District, 1971 Rush-Mendon Road, Rush 14543. For more information or questions, please call Mr. Meston at 533-2411. The deadline is October 10th, 2007.

EQUIPMENT: Due to another new State Law which was passed last month, the Fire District may have to spend over \$13,000 on a rescue rope system for firefighters who go into a burning structure. ALL Fire Departments in NY State except one, have been given 60 days to comply. This law was passed because of two FDNY firefighter deaths this past year. Who has been exempted from this new law, you guessed it - the NY City Fire Dept. is exempt from this law!

FIRE DEPARTMENT & AMBULANCE: We welcome three new members into the department. They are Jacob Vogt of Park Lane, Daniel Gress of Chapman Road and Robert Reed of Five-Points Road. Mr. Reed was

a Brockport Firefighter for several years. Congratulations to **Stephanie Davis** on becoming our newest EMT.

CONGRATULATIONS TO HENRIETTA FIRE COMPANY #1: They are 100 years old. Rush attended their parade on August 25th and won a total of \$750 in prizes. We presented them with two plaques (one serious and one funny). We also marched through a second time wearing "South Henrietta" red shirts. We also hung a "North Rush" Banner on their station.

FIRE PREVENTION: A full week schedule will be conducted at the Leary School and other locations during fire prevention week. We feel that these efforts do work and help control accidental fires and resulting injuries or death in Rush.

WINTER IS COMING: The heating season will soon be here. If you have a wood stove PLEASE have your chimney cleaned. If you heat by gas or oil have the heating unit inspected. Over the years the Rush community has done a very good job in this area and with few exceptions, fires, death and injury has been minimal. We would like to see these incidents completely eliminated!

EXPLORERS: We are up to four members. The Rush FD Explorer post hosted the Monroe County meeting in September. Forty explorers from around the county attended.

CARNIVAL 2007: Thursday night was rained out but the new extension kept everyone dry and we did make some money. The fireworks had to be cancelled due to the weather and the fact that not many people were there to watch. Planned for 2008, is the Boys Scouts BBQ Chicken, the Kiddie Parade will be on Saturday and the Fireworks will be Saturday night. We got mixed reviews on the band so we will be looking that over. If you liked the idea of a band, let a firefighter know.

FUND DRIVE: The second request was sent out September 17. These reminders are for the 600 residents who did not respond to our May request. Over 700 of the 1,300 residents of Rush sent in a donation or selected their United Way donation to go to us. **A SINCERE THANKS TO THOSE WHO RESPONDED!**

LADIES AUXILIARY: ELECTION DAY HAM DINNER is Tuesday, November 6, 2007, 4:30 PM - 7:00 PM at the Rush Fire Department. Tickets are \$7 Adults, \$6 Seniors (over 60 years old), \$4 children, children under 5 years of age eat free. Proceeds fund our scholarship



Reminder

Just a reminder to those residents making installment payments on their **2007-2008 School tax bills, the second and third installments are sent directly to the Monroe County Treasury and are NOT sent to the Town.** Full payments for school tax bills will be accepted in the Town Clerk's Office through the month of October but after the 1st of the month a 2% interest penalty must be added. No taxes may be collected after the 31st of October by the Rush collector.

By now, everyone who received the Basic STAR exemption in 2007, should have received their application in the mail to apply for their rebate check. These applications can be completed online or mailed back to Albany. To receive a rebate check, the application must be received by the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance by November 30, 2007. If you have any questions regarding this process, please feel free to contact our office.

We are beginning to prepare for the renewal process for many of our exemptions including Enhanced STAR, Senior and Agricultural. It is anticipated that we will mail out the renewals by the end of November. All renewals must be received in the Assessor's Office by March 1, 2008. It is not necessary to wait to receive your renewal in the mail. If you wish to renew any exemptions, they can be accepted at any time until the deadline date. If you have any questions on what exemptions you may qualify for, exemptions you receive or renewal, please contact us.
